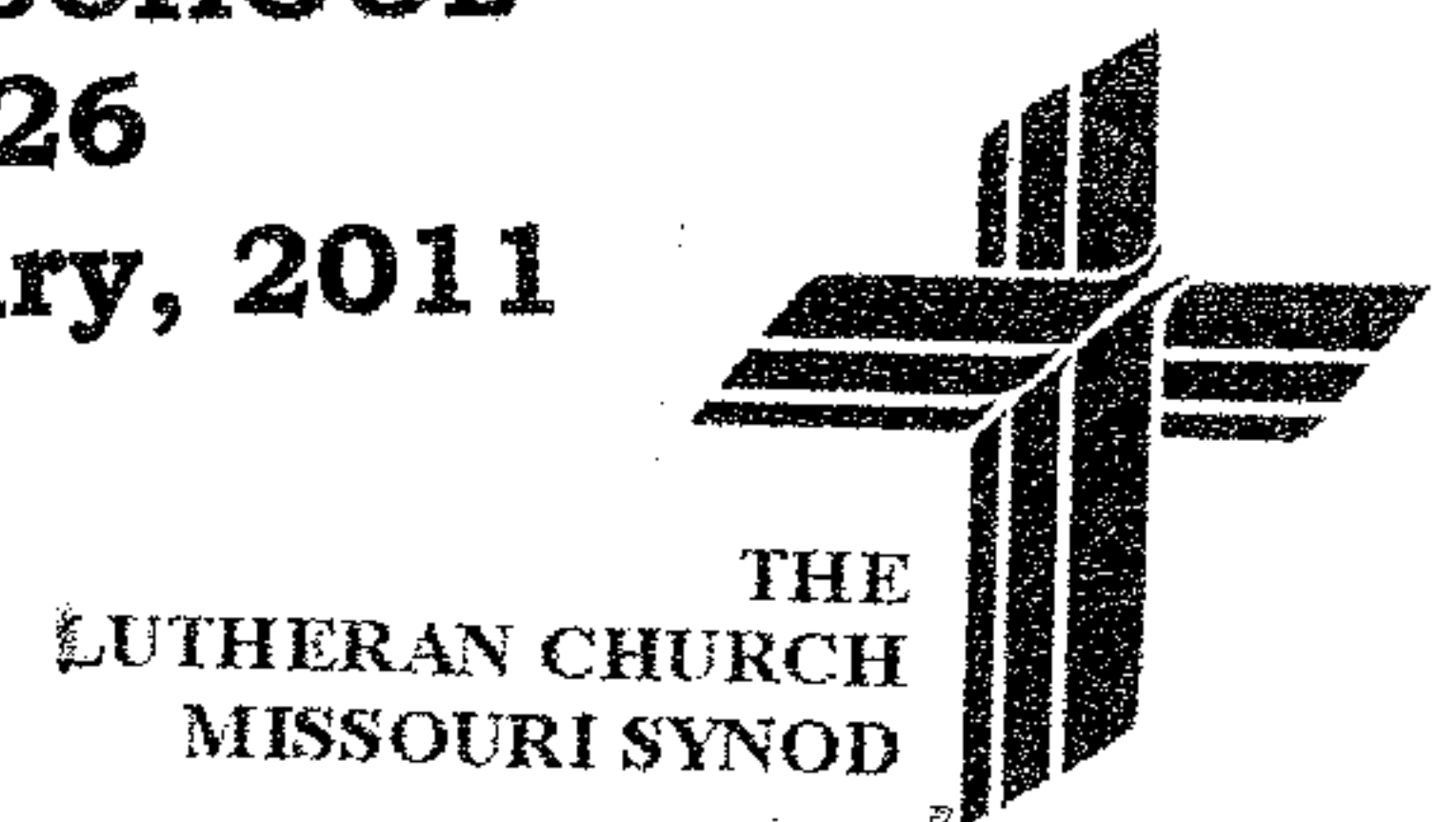

The last of our Christmas presents are being put away as I write this on January 17<sup>th</sup>. One of the gifts that we received was a little book entitled "Laughing with Lutherans", edited by Julie B. Sevig. It's a small book of only 144 6" x 6" pages. It has a smiling Rev. Dr. Marlin Luther on the cover.

This little book shares some Lutheran congregation's bulletin and newsletter "bloopers" along with some humorous things that Lutheran people [usually kids] have said. I found myself often smiling as I read such things as: "The ... choir anthem: 'Surely, He Hath Borne Our Briefs'".

It brought to mind some of the bulletin and newsletter "bloopers" from my nearly 35 years as a pastor. I had read over what I had written, but still I missed that I had substituted one word for another. I wrote: "We will be serving snakes after the Sunrise Service". A lady came up to me after receiving the newsletter and asked in all sincerity, "Pastor, are we really going to have snakes on Easter?" (I had meant to type "snacks".)

These sorts of errors can bring a smile or make us laugh. And I guess that they will continue to happen as long as we send messages to each other with words, text, code, etc.

The message that the Lord God has for all people in the scriptures [the Holy Bible] has a few things that can bring a smile to your face as you read them or when you hear them read. Jesus once spoke about a person with a log in their eye trying to help get a speck out of another person's eye - what an image! And how about Peter who put back on the clothes he had taken off to fish, and then he jumped into the Sea of Tiberias.

The good news that God the Father loves all people and that He sent His Son to be the Savior of the world should also bring a smile to our face. This smile is a smile of joy! Someone once said: "Smile, God loves you!" By faith you and I know that's true.

**COFFEE HOST**

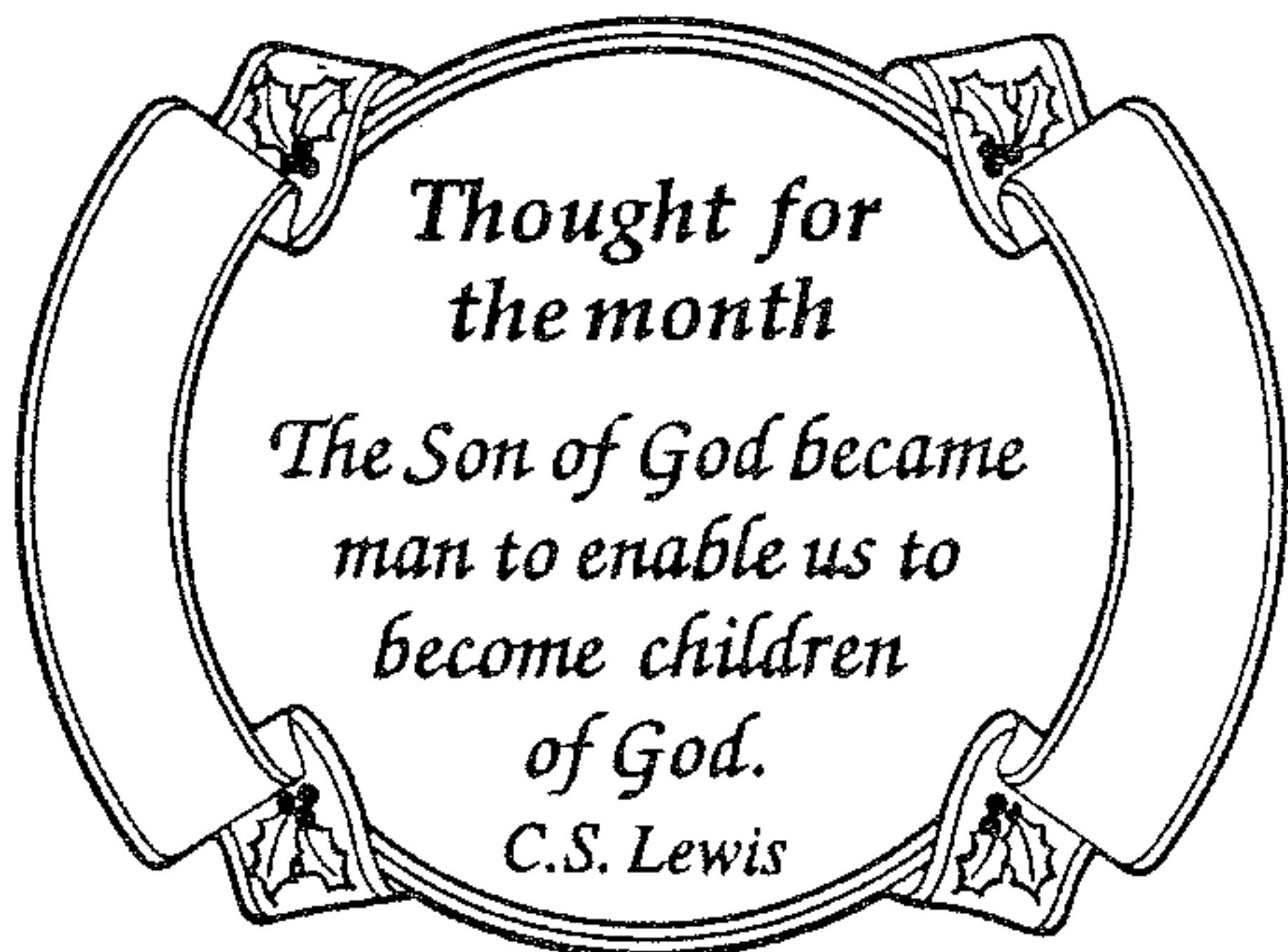
You are invited to host coffee hour after the worship service on Sundays. A sign up sheet is in the narthex on the bulletin board.

# Highlights - January Church Council Meeting

---

The January Church Council meeting was well attended. Our Council members are doing a great job and the year is off to a wonderfully good start! The following is a *brief* summary of the meeting highlights:

1. This year's Christmas tree was provided with the stellar work of our Trustee Chair and a generous donation from the tree seller. After Christmas, the tree was recycled too.
2. We discussed the need for a common calendar that is available both in the office and electronically. The calendar on the website should be the most current information that we have about church, small group and committee activities as well as a record of who is using our building and when.
3. Our financial situation is mostly positive. We had a generous donation and good contributions in December.
4. On Jan 22<sup>nd</sup> there was a memorial for Pastor Peterson's wife.
5. On Jan 24-28<sup>th</sup> Pastor Flath will be in San Diego working with LCMS Operation Barnabus.
6. Confirmation classes are again underway. There are two confirmands this year.
7. The best time to reach Pastor Flath is on Tuesdays and Wednesdays in the office. He is in the office by 9am and is usually here until late in the day.
8. The Elders are working on a follow-up plan for our visitors. The Elders will be working closely with the office staff on this project.
9. Our District office would like a current copy of our By-Laws. Our By-Laws are now on our website if anyone would like to read them. Just go to our web page [StTimothyLutheran.net](http://StTimothyLutheran.net) then in the blue box on the left side click on the "About St Timothy" link. Once there, click on the Documents and Procedures link at the very bottom of the page. You will find all kinds of interesting things on our web page!
10. Mel and the office staff are working on the Directory. Everyone should have one by now.
11. We received a request to again donate to the Jeremiah Center. Since the first donation was made at the Voter's Meeting, the Council decided to allow the Voters to decide whether or not to again donate to this local youth organization. This topic will be on the next Voter's Meeting agenda.
12. Another topic for the next Voter's Meeting will be the roof repair. A recent, generous donation helps keep the cost of this project within our reach financially. There are several options for the project.
13. Creekside Korean Church is in need of a new facility as they are no longer able to worship in their current building. The needs of this congregation were discussed to see if there was a way that we could help them through their immediate space needs. With our busy calendar we were only able to offer them some limited use of our sanctuary. This did not meet their needs, however so they will not be using our building.
14. Finally, the Council received a report from the Call Committee. The candidates and the Call Committee process were discussed. No decisions were made, but a good sharing of information and ideas is moving us closer to finding a good fit for our congregation. More to come...

As you can see.... A lot happens at Council Meetings! All of our meetings are open door and you will be welcomed. Please consider attending to see what happens and more importantly, come and provide some input. The more we hear from members – the better we are able to meet the needs of members. Our next meeting is Tuesday, February 8, 2011.

### **CHURCH COUNCIL**

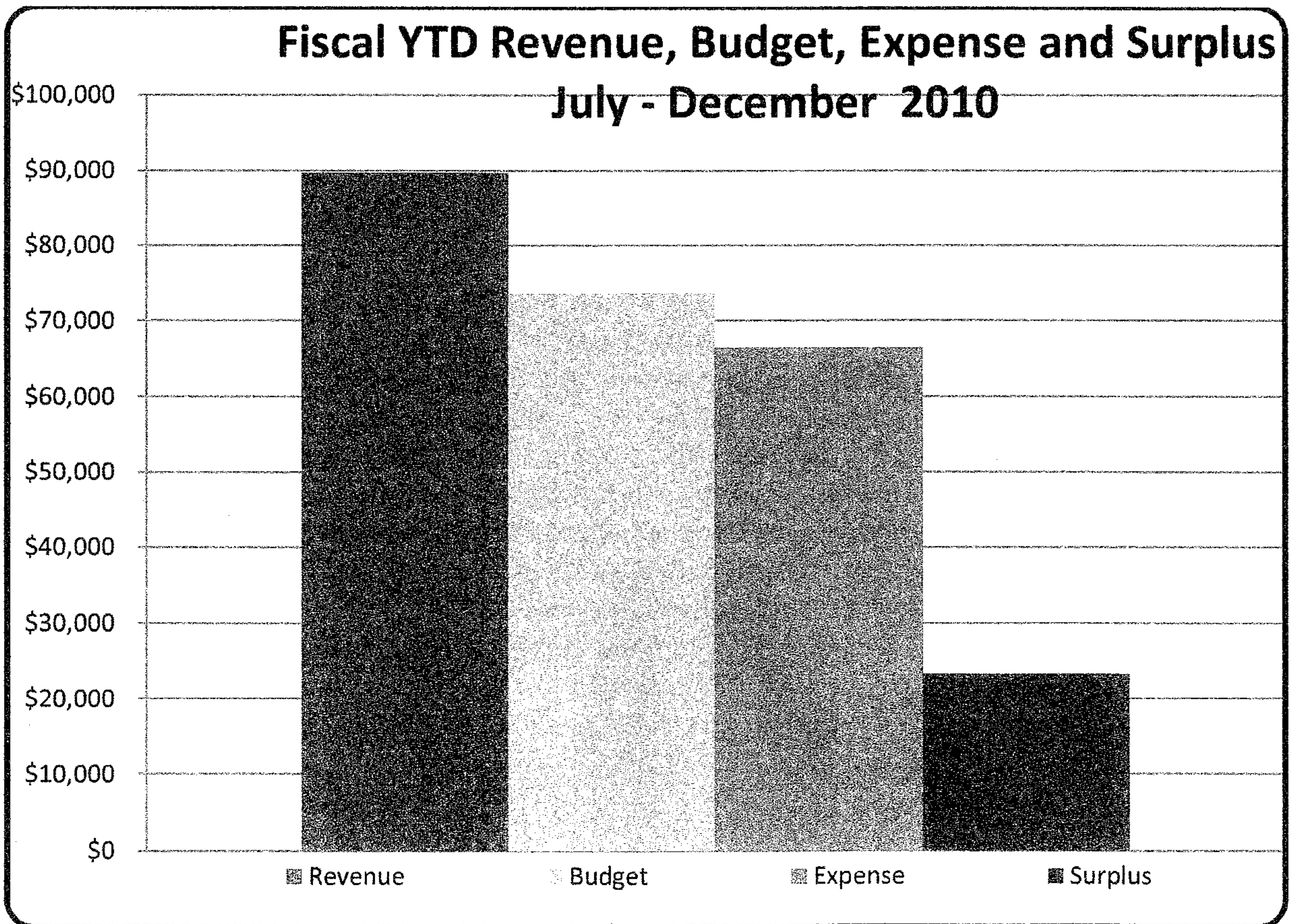
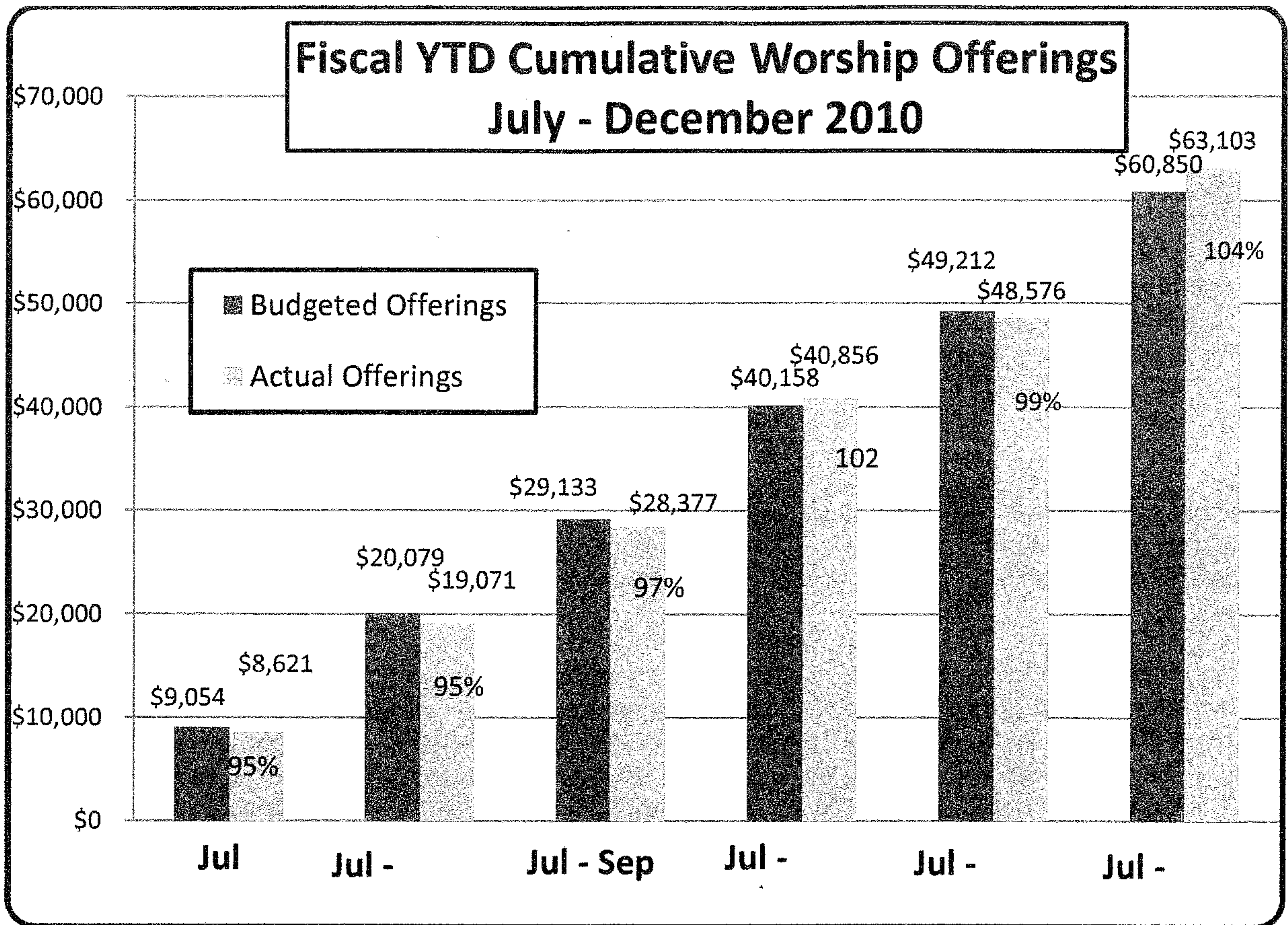
