June 2011 A.D. -- Thoughts From The Pastor

Christ is risen! [He is risen indeed, alleluia!]

We celebrate Pentecost 50 days after Jesus' resurrection from the dead on Easter. Pentecost this year is June 12th. It is sometimes called the birthday of the New Testament church since around 3,000 people were brought to saving faith in Jesus by the Holy Spirit through the preaching of the Gospel by our Lord's apostles.

Without the Holy Spirit's work in your life and in my life through the good news about Jesus, we would not believe in Jesus as our Lord and Savior. As a matter of fact, it's only because of the on going work of the Spirit in our life that you and I are kept in the one true faith.

The Holy Spirit would not have come on Pentecost without one last, glorious event in Jesus' life. Jesus had told His disciples even before He died on the cross that He had to leave them. But He would then send to them His special gift of a Comforter, a Councilor. The Holy Spirit would be sent to guide us into all truth.

With Jesus' resurrection to life on the 3rd day after His death, the disciples may have thought that Jesus was going to be visibly present with them forever. But after 40 days of giving many proofs that He was alive, Jesus visibly left this world and was received into heaven as the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords. [Ascension Day is celebrated June 2nd this year.]

Even so, Jesus continues to be present with His church and all of His disciples of every century. Jesus comes to us in His Word and in the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. And because Jesus is no longer confined by time and space, He has promised to be with His followers always, to the very end of time. That means that Jesus is with you as you read this and me as I write this.

At the Lord Jesus' ascension into heaven, one final promise was given to the Lord's disciples of all times and places. It is a promise that you and I are still waiting to have fulfilled by Jesus. Those who were with Jesus on ascension day watched Him rise up before their eyes and then be hidden by some clouds. Then they were told by some angels that one day Jesus would return again. [Acts 1:6-12]

No one knows when that day will be except God the Father - and He's not telling. Over the years a few people have predicted various dates for Jesus' 2nd coming. Those days have come and gone.

The importance of not knowing the date of Jesus' return is so that you and I are ready for His return each and every day of our lives. With the Holy Spirit's help as He works through the Word of God and the sacraments, you and I faithfully wait for Christ Jesus' return in glory.

Like the early church, as we wait, we too "devote (ourselves) to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, the breaking of bread and the prayers" [Acts 2:42]. We "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that (Jesus has) commanded (us)." [Matthew 28:19-20]

May our waiting for Jesus' return to productive for the kingdom of God! Christ is risen! [He is risen indeed, alleluia!]

May the love of the Lord Jesus always be in your hearts.

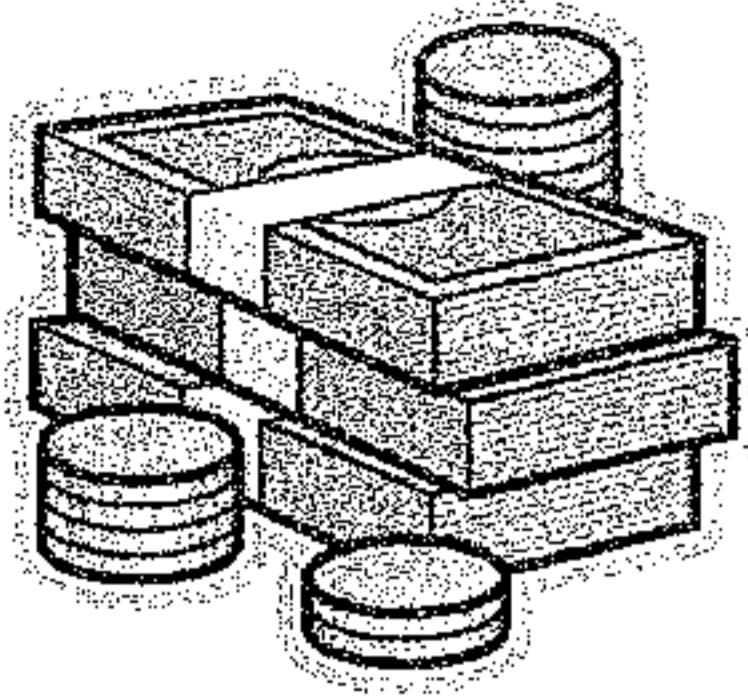

FINANCIAL REPORT - Mel Suelzle



April contribution performance was very good at almost 113% of our budget. Preschool tuition was lower than planned and our total income for the month was 94.7% of plan which is close to the trend for the entire year of 95.5%. While expense spending was not excessive, our budgeted pastor expenses were not adjusted to reflect our decision last Fall to pursue a Vacancy Pastor position with the appropriate expense budget levels. As a result, our budget was incorrect and our Elder budget performance looks very poor. This will continue for the month of May and to a smaller degree in June, as we have significant budget for Guest Pastor services. Our mortgage donations were well above plan at 133%, but still only 84% of our mortgage payment. Overall income fell short of our expenses by \$582 for April but for the 10 month of the year, we have a surplus of \$22,118.

Your Council is well into the 2011/12 budget process. Preliminary budgets are being consolidated and will be adjusted during the June 14th council meeting as we work towards final revision and presentation to the Voters later in June.
